The project ADRIPASS - funded under Interreg Adriatic-Ionian Programme and led by CEI-ES, aims at improving maritime-hinterland freight connections to boost growth and economic development of the transport sector in the ADRION region.

ADRIPASS is a key strategic project that involves eleven international project partners belonging to eight countries of the Adriatic-Ionian area (Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Greece, Italy, Montenegro, Serbia, Slovenia). Within ADRIPASS, project partners worked together on different project activities (data collection, test of specific and innovative ICT solutions in Ports to provide better tools for Port - hinterland integration and a final transfer of analyses and results to key policymakers) for providing instruments to Adriatic - Ionian politician and private stakeholder to plan and invest in solutions making ADRION logistics nodes better integrated into TEN-T network. Thanks to the soft measures adopted for improving maritime-hinterland multimodal freight connections in ADRION, ADRIPASS identified a valid logistics alternative for freight traffics with origin or destination in the area.
