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AT A GLANCE

A growing ageing population and increasing number of isolated older adults demand new approaches and political commitment. Therefore, the WHO developed the concept of sustainable age-friendly environments (AFE), using an integrative approach to optimize the social and physical environments and promote active, healthy ageing and participation in society. The T.A.A.F.E. project uses this concept to build a participatory framework - T.A.A.F.E. model - for developing an age-friendly environment and an improved delivery of services in the Alpine Space (AS).

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Objective

During this first phase, Grenoble University and IAT have prepared booklets with methodological guidelines and practical tricks and tips on implementing different steps of TAAFE Model at local level. The booklets have been given to TRIOs at every transnational workshop (see Deliverable D.T1.3.1) in order to help them implement what they will learn there.

During this period, we produced three booklets for stakeholders and for Trios (Annex 1); we also decided to print them into one "guide for older citizens and for local action group for Age-friendly Community", translated in each local language (Annex 2).

Booklet for stakeholders (3) - for stakeholders, to help them to involve actively in cocreation process

- made as one small guide with three parts representing three booklets
- sent in pdf
- printed and distributed by post

Booklets for trios (5) - given to TRIOs at every transnational workshop (total of 5) in order to help them implement what they will learn there.

- Slovenia worksop (from worksheet 1 to 5) (*prepared during this reporting period*, *delivered with the next reporting period*).

Targets

The targets are all the 6 Trios and, beyond, all population of local partners.

The delivering of booklets has been adapted due to the cancellation of a transnational workshop and its transfer into an on-line workshop (see Deliverable D.T1.3.1).
